SUNDAY OF ALL SAINTS The first Sunday after the Feast of Holy Pentecost is observed by the Byzantine Church as the Sunday of All Saints. This day has been designated as a commemoration of all of the Saints, all the Righteous, the Prophets, Apostles, Martyrs, Confessors, Shepherds, Teachers, and Holy Monastics, both men and women alike, known and unknown, who have been added to the choirs of the Saints and shall be added, from the time of Adam until the end of the world, who have been

perfected in piety and have glorified God by their holy lives.

JUNE 18 † **MARTYR LEONTIUS**, and with him



Martyrs Hypatius and Theodoulos, at Tripoli in Syria (73) An honored Roman commander in Tripoli of Phoenicia, he was described as being 'of great physical stature, powerful, strong and bold in battle'. When it was learned that he was a Christian and had given grain to the poor from the imperial storehouse, the governor Hadrian, a great persecutor of Christians, sent

Hypatius, a military commander, and Theodoulus, a soldier, along with some others to arrest him. On the way Hypatius fell gravely ill with a fever, and the company had to delay its mission. One night an angel of the Lord appeared to Hypatius and said, 'If you desire to be healed, you and your soldiers must cry to heaven three times: "O God of Leontius, help me!"'. Hypatius told his comrades of his vision, and when they all cried out as instructed Hypatius was instantly healed. Hypatius and Theodoulos then went on ahead of the other soldiers and found Leontius. Leontius received them hospitably and offered them refreshment. As they rested in his house, he proclaimed his faith in Christ and their hearts began to burn within them. Both men were baptized in the Name of the All-Holy Trinity. When the cruel Hadrian discovered this, he had the two soldiers beaten fiercely and then beheaded; he subjected Leontius to the cruelest tortures. under which he finally died, unwavering in his faith. This was during the reign of Vespasian.

JUNE 19 † HOLY APOSTLE JUDE, THE

BROTHER OF THE LORD (80) He was one of the Twelve and a kinsman of the Lord according to the flesh (see Luke 6:16, Acts 1:13; According to holy Tradition, Joseph the Carpenter, before he was widowed, had four sons by his wife Salome: James, Hosea, Simon and Jude). As an Apostle, St Jude preached in Mesopotamia, Arabia and Syria, and met a Martyr's end in Beirut. He is the author of the New Testament Epistle that bears his name. His name ("Judas" in Greek, from "Judah" in Hebrew) means "praise".

Prayer for Patience with Children

While your children bring you pride and joy, they can also cause you great consternation. Don't they understand that you are telling them the truth? Don't they understand that you know best?

First, you must change your

attitude. You are not always right. And even when you are right, you must understand that your children are autonomous individuals, walking their own paths. You made mistakes, and they will make mistakes. They cannot always see things the way you do, because they are not you.

If you wish to teach your children, you must do so with love. Then you must pray and wait. Lack of patience will only lead to further misunderstanding and resistance. To grow in patience you must grow in love and faith: love for your Lord and love for your children, faith in your Lord and faith in your children.

I cannot raise them well on my own. I need your help. These children are more yours than mine. Help me trust that, in your love for them, you will protect them.

HOLY APOSTLES' FAST (Fast of Sts. Peter &

Paul) According to the Handbook of the Eparchy, the faithful are asked to maintain a simple fast or abstinence which forbids the use of meat and meat products, but does not forbid the use of eggs and dairy products, on all Fridays during this Penitential season. (Although, it is recommended that it be observed on Wednesdays as well.)

The Holy Apostles prepared themselves for the coming of the Holy Spirit with much prayer and fasting, just as they did before they went out into the world to preach the glorious Good News of Christ and appointed

priests (Acts 14:22). It has been called at times, "the Pentecost Fast" because it comes after that Feast.

Because it is a custom, whose practices and length varied GREATLY within the East and West, there has been little uniformity among the Christian Churches. We seem to follow the prescription of the Synod of Zamost (1720) which "mentions that Petriwka (Peter's Fast) lasted from the first Sunday after Pentecost, that is, from the Sunday of All Saints to the feast of the Apostles SS. Peter and Paul." (Julian J. Katrij, pg. 390).

LOAN UPDATE

Last Wednesday, our Eastern Church celebrated the feast of Barnabas. His original name was Joseph, but the Apostles called him Barnabas because they felt this name, which translates as "encourager," described him so much better. The Book of Acts twice records his efforts to help those in need. First, he generously gave all his personal property to the Apostles for the needs of the Church; then, he raised money to be sent to relieve the Christians in Jerusalem experiencing famine. It seems so appropriate that on his feast, our bishop and Fr. Wes outlined the unprecedented generosity of our brothers and sisters of the Eparchy: they agreed to give of their excess as a loan to the Eparchy. This will enable the Eparchy to buy out our entire loan from California Bank and Trust by July 1st.

We will then begin paying back our loan to the Eparchy at about \$9,100 a month for 15 years. The interest rate will be 2%.

All but 2 parishes in the Eparchy contributed toward this project, and these parishes are having some difficulties of their own.

The various parishes are contributing \$941,500.

The Eparchy is contributing \$437,000.
