THE BOOK OF REMEMBRANCE AT THE BYZANTINE CATHOLIC SEMINARY

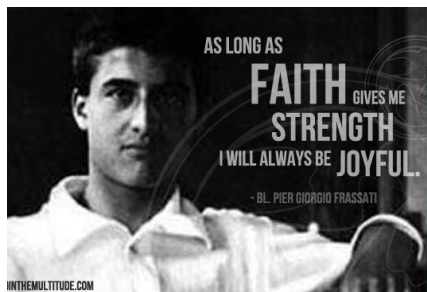

A SAINT FOR OUR TIME:

Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati is a saint for the modern world, and especially for the young people of our time. Born in

1901 in Turin, Italy, his time on earth was short-only 24 years-but he filled it passionately with holy living. Pier Giorgio was a model of virtue, a "man of the beatitudes," as Pope John Paul II called him at the saint's beatification ceremony in Rome on May 20, 1990. He was described by friends as "an explosion of joy." As Pier Giorgio's sister, Luciana, says of her brother in her biography of him, "He represented the finest in Christian youth: pure, happy,

enthusiastic about everything that is good and beautiful."

To our modern world which is often burdened by cynicism and angst, Pier Giorgio's life offers a brilliant contrast, a life rich in meaning, purpose, and peace derived from faith in God. From the earliest age, and despite two unreligious parents who misunderstood and disapproved of his piety and intense interest in Catholicism, Pier Giorgio placed Christ first in all that he did.

Pier Giorgio prayed daily, offering, among other prayers, a daily rosary on his knees by his bedside. Often his agnostic father would find him asleep in this position. "He gave his whole self, both in prayer and in action, in service to Christ," Luciana Frassati writes. And yet, he was fun loving, an outdoorsman and a man who loved talking with his friends.

VENERABLE ANTHONY OF THE KIEV FAR CAVES. JULY 10TH

(From the OCA website) St Anthony is mentioned during the prayer of blessing of the Bread, Wine and Oil for Lityá.

The Saint Anthony of the Kiev Caves was born in the year 983 at Liubech, not far from Chernigov. Possessing the fear of God from his youth, he desired to be clothed in the monastic schema. When he reached a mature age, he wandered until he arrived on Mt. Athos, burning with the desire to emulate the deeds of its holy inhabitants. Here he received monastic tonsure, and the young monk pleased God in every aspect of his spiritual struggles on the path of virtue. The igumen saw in St Anthony the great future ascetic, and inspired by God, he sent him back to his native land, saying, "Anthony, it is time for you to guide others in holiness. Return to your own Russian land, and be an example for others. May the blessing of the Holy Mountain be with you."

Through the Providence of God, Anthony came to the hills of Kiev by the banks of the River Dniepr. The forested area near the village of Berestovo reminded him of his beloved Athos. There he found a cave which had been dug out by the Priest Hilarion, who later became Metropolitan of Kiev (October 21). Since he liked the spot, Anthony prayed with tears, "Lord, let the blessing of Mt. Athos be upon this spot, and strengthen me to remain here." He began to struggle in prayer, fasting, vigil and physical labor. People began to come to the ascetic for his blessing and counsel, and some decided to remain with the saint. In time a thriving monastery grow around this holy man with up to 100 men dedicating their lives to God.

EUGENICS AND ETHICS “DESIGNER BABIES, WHOSE DESIGN?”

“And God saw everything that he had made, and, behold, it was very good.” Genesis 1:3

Rationale: Advances in genetic testing have given rise to an increasingly vocal and aggressive new form of eugenics. Pre-implantation genetic testing enables technicians to determine if an embryo engendered in a Petri dish has any genetic defects so that they can then eliminate that particular embryo. Pre-natal genetic testing poses similar threats. Parents can choose to eliminate a child with genetic defects before it is born. Or if the parents are willing to accept a disabled child, they could face threats from the state and/or from the insurance company to eliminate financial support if they refuse to abort the child. This is sometimes euphemistically referred to as the search for “*designer babies*”. However, in the final analysis, parents or laboratory technicians cannot “design” babies. They merely eliminate the ones who do not measure up to their standards of quality control or who are not the desired gender. This is truly the new face of eugenics. Most chilling is the American Medical Association seems to be fostering this concept, including cloning. Is eugenics a problem today? **Yes the FDA is considering human gene splicing, actively changing human DNA.** This is the beginning of a “Brave New World”.
